

A curated leadership development program designed for student leaders of your CCAs to uncover each other's strengths, forge deeper relationships with one another, grow into changemaking leaders and collaborate on meaningful projects that create social impact.



Learning Goals

- 1 Cultivate empathy in students towards different communities and social issues in Singapore and spark their curiosity to learn more
- 2 Enable students to learn from and network with each other across different student clubs through sharing best practices
- 3 Nurture student leaders to discover each other's strengths and practice collaborating with each other on meaningful projects that create social impact.


Format

Part 1

Asset Mapping Workshop (3 hours)

In our experience with community building in A Good Space, the first step towards fostering collaboration is getting student leaders to know each other and create opportunities for them to connect on a more personal level.

In this workshop, students will uncover their strengths through guided prompts and practice asking and offering help to each other, practicing the first steps of collaboration.



Part 2

Ideation Workshop with Changemakers (4 hours)

We can invite 3 changemakers who have deep experience working on the ground to share key issues and problem statements they think students can work on.

Afterwards, students are guided using the 'Crazy8s' process to brainstorm ideas for projects they can start and begin having conversations on teams they can form.

Part 3

Students Start Social Impact Projects

After identifying the ideas for projects they want to work on and forming teams with students from other CCAs, students embark on their social impact projects to create meaningful change for various communities.



Part 4

Changemaking Skills Workshop (4 hours)

We can conduct a workshop on particular topics that will be relevant for students in leading their student clubs or changemaking initiatives.


Some possible topics we can cover include: (i) Polarity Thinking - which looks at how to navigate complexity, (ii) Futures Thinking - a tool for strategic planning that identifies multiple possible futures and (iii) Community Building - philosophies students can use to build close-knit teams.

Part 5

Learning Circle (3 hours)

We can organize a learning circle to facilitate cross-sharing of knowledge and best practices amongst student leaders of different clubs, which helps foster collaboration amongst them to build shared knowledge.

Some topics could include: (i) how can I attract and retain volunteers for my club? (ii) how can I design an engaging virtual event that my participants feel excited for? (iii) how can I use different methods to engage the beneficiaries of my club?



Part 6

Mentoring (Ad-Hoc)

As they embark on their projects, students are mentored by relevant changemakers who can share their expertise, resources and networks to help the students bring their ideas to life.

Timeline

Typically, the activities are spaced out and happen monthly, for a total program duration of about 9 months, roughly spanning two semesters (and one academic year).
